AMAZON CLIMATE ALLIANCE

It is a coalition for tackling climate change, in response to the historic drought in the Amazon in 2023. Conceived by FAS, the Alliance already has the support of 80 civil society organizations, companies and research institutes. The coalition mapped the areas most affected by the drought and mobilized donations of food, drinking water, medicine and other basic necessities for communities and isolated areas. On another front of the Alliance, researchers and analysts are monitoring the fluctuations in the flood pulse of the Amazon River basin and climatic factors to identify trends and provide recommendations to support state and municipal governments in combating extreme events and for climate adaptation actions.



Innovation and Education Centers for Sustainable Development (Nieds)

Nieds are spaces that consist of classrooms, a library, accommodation, a computer lab and agro-ecological production units, built in riverside areas in the Amazon. In 2023, the FAS centers hosted 58 educational activities that benefited 107 communities and involved more than 2,000 people.

*PRESENTATION ∞

The year 2023 represents a historic milestone for FAS. As a result of a competitive process, we have been selected as the executing agency for two major programs for the Amazon funded by the governments of Germany and Great Britain. The Standing Forest Program (initially called the Forest Fund) will involve assistance to the state governments of Amazonas and Pará, while the REDD Early Movers Program (REM-MT) will support the government of Mato Grosso. In both initiatives, FAS will contribute to the reduction of deforestation and the promotion of the local bioeconomy.

In the year in which we celebrated 15 years of history, we have updated our 2030 strategic plan, aiming for an even more successful future in our purpose of a living and prosperous Amazon. With

the expert advice of Bain & Company, the plan is already having positive effects, which can be seen in the improvement of our institutional culture and the synergy between all areas of the FAS with a focus on financial sustainability, which will allow us to go further with impact initiatives.

The 2023 Activities Report presents a portrait of FAS's sensitive and systemic approach, which translates into significant results, from education to environmental conservation. We highlight the implementation of the Guardians of the Forest Program, a public policy in the state of Amazonas that updates and expands the historic Bolsa Floresta Program. This new program has so far benefited 11,535 families, reaching 591 communities and localities in 28 Conservation Units in the state.



Our achievements for the Amazon resonate and accumulate prestige nationally and internationally. In 2023, we were honored to represent Brazil as the only organization in the country among the three finalists for the renowned Zayed Sustainability Prize in the "Climate Action" category.

So many achievements and recognitions can only come true with the invaluable collaboration of our network of partnerships and a solid management structure. We have concluded another successful cycle of the Board of Administration, marked by eight years of competent leadership by Benjamin Sicsú and Neliton Marques. To them, all our gratitude. We begin 2024 with the election of Luiz Furlan and Izolena Garrido to the next

cycle of the Board, along with a renewed body of board members, who will further strengthen the strategic management of the foundation. In this way, we reinforce our commitment to the Amazon, its biodiversity and its peoples, on the road to a sustainable future.



EDUCATION FOR SUSTAINABILITY

Education to act in the present and transform the future of the Amazon. FAS's actions support formal education and stimulate the development of the potential of students and teachers in remote areas, where guaranteeing quality education is especially challenging.

The foundation runs a series of educational programs and projects in the Amazon region, including early childhood care and riverine adolescence, health education and the empowerment of traditional populations. Find out more about our work in "Education for Sustainability" in 2023.

* EDUCATION AND CITIZENSHIP



Last year, the educational programs and actions carried out by FAS mobilized more than 8,000 people, including teachers, children and teenagers, in riverside communities and municipalities in Amazonas, Brazil's largest state in terms of land area.

Among the highlights of the year were courses on agroecology and biodiversity in riverside communities, and the Integral Development of Riverside Children and Adolescents in the Amazon (Dicara) project, which promotes sports practices and teaching environmental education and citizenship and carried out actions in Uarini, Fonte Boa, Novo Aripuanã and Presidente Figueiredo (AM).

In 2023, FAS held 15 workshops as part of the "Repórteres da Floresta" project on different communication techniques, with support from BNDES and the Bem Maior Movement. Around 130 young riverside members from 10 communities located in Sustainable Development Reserves (RDS) in Amazonas benefited. Tainara Cruz is one of the young people who took part in the project.

In 2023, through the Telehealth system, 633 telehealth consultations and 621 teleorientations to health professionals were carried out.

* HEALTH EDUCATION



On another educational front, FAS offers health education to people working in traditional communities in the Amazon. Last year, 58 professionals in the area received training on the clinical management of post-Covid-19 conditions in Primary Health Care, in which nurses, doctors and nutritionists took part, covering 5 municipalities in Amazonas. In addition, 43 community health agents (ACS) underwent training in Early Childhood in the Riverside.

In addition, these professionals on the front line of health care in the Amazon have teleconsultations with specialists at their disposal. This entire structure is made possible by the 67 connectivity points strategically installed by the FAS in Conservation Units. The technology shortens distances and helps the work of municipal health departments. In 2023, more than 600 remote medical, nursing and psychological consultations were carried out through the telehealth system.

* EMPOWERMENT

Formed in 2023, the Network of Women of the Waters and Forests brings together and strengthens dozens of female leaders in the North and Northeast. The initiative is incubated by FAS and supported by the Brazil Foundation.

FAS works together with the peoples of the Amazon, so that they are increasingly empowered in their mission to take care of socio-biodiversity, for this and many generations to come. To this end, the foundation supports the strengthening and appreciation of indigenous knowledge by encouraging sport and culture. In the ten years of the Indigenous Archery project, completed in 2023, dozens of young indigenous athletes have been trained and, in total, they have won 53 medals in national and international competitions.

FAS is potentiating female empowerment in the Amazon. In partnership with the Vinci Aeroportos network and support from Azul, Bemol, Escola de Ativismo and Solar - Coca-Cola, FAS held the first edition of the Women of the Forest Seminar. The event brought together more than 80 representatives of community organizations, entrepreneurs, researchers, activists and other female leaders in Manaus for a program on guaranteeing rights, public policies and business management with a focus on Amazonian women.

FAS is the co-organizer of Virada Sustentável in Manaus. In 2023, the event was held on November 4 and 5, with the support of Bemol, Águas de Manaus and Innova.

AMAZON BIOECONOMY

Caring for nature and cultivating prosperity in the Amazon is hard, collective, gradual and systemic work. All of FAS's achievements have relied on a network of people and organizations integrated in the same purpose of keeping the forest standing, with well-being and dignity for the people of the forest. Investments generate positive impacts and add up over the years. And the systemic approach makes it possible to connect science, traditional knowledge and the demands of the territories.

And this connection is strengthened by entrepreneurship, investment in community infrastructure, environmental conservation and research, development and innovation. Follow up on FAS's year in "Amazon Bioeconomy" programs and projects.

✧ ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND INCOME

FAS encourages bioeconomy initiatives in the Amazon, such as the Formiguinhas do Saracá handicraft group, from the Rio Negro Sustainable Development Reserve (RDS) in the state of Amazonas. The artisans took part in a laboratory to develop pieces inspired by local biodiversity which were launched on the Americanas digital sales platform, in partnership with the FAS initiative called Jirau da Amazônia. In all, the 10 craft groups supported by FAS had a turnover of R\$ 273,000 in 2023.

In another action, now focusing on indigenous entrepreneurship, FAS, COIAB, Makira E'ta, with funding from Google.org, launched the "Parentas que fazem" call for proposals. The project selected indigenous women's associations in Amazonas to offer entrepreneurial training, technical support in business management, and a direct investment of R\$ 1,250,000.

The forest product fairs held in Manaus also support the economy by connecting producers to the end consumer. The managed pirarucu and tambaqui fairs generated sales of R\$409,177. With Bradesco's support, Piraruclub, a subscription-based marketing club for sustainably managed pirarucu, earned more than R\$ 158,000 in 2023.

* COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE

To support another promising economic sector, community-based tourism, FAS is investing in sustainable hospitality structures, such as the Casa Luz Amazônia Chalet, in the Saracá Community, and the installation of a solar energy system at the Canto do Japiim Restaurant, also located in the Rio Negro RDS. The community infrastructure projects are carried out in



a participatory way with the residents and extend to other areas, such as health, with the installation of the first dental post in the Tumbira Community, and education, with the construction of the Educare houses, reading points associated with schools in the Três Unidos and Punã (AM) communities.

FAS supported the Nova Esperança Indigenous Community, in the Puranga Conquista Sustainable Development Reserve, in building a handicraft workshop

With the Forest Guardians Program, those who live in the territory and help protect the Amazon's biodiversity are rewarded for the environmental services they provide. In 2023, the public policy of the state of Amazonas went further and reached more people: with the implementation of FAS, 28 Conservation Units and more than 11,000 families are currently participating in the program, which also includes community strengthening components and support for local production chains, such as flour and pirarucu sustainable management.

In yet another collaboration with the Government of Amazonas, FAS is supporting the fight against forest fires in nine priority municipalities in the state. The cooperation involves purchasing materials, donating equipment, training local firefighting teams and public awareness campaigns. The initiative also has a partnership with the Re:wild organization.

* RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT AND INNOVATION



With more than 15 years of history in developing socio-environmental solutions in the Amazon, FAS continues to expand its operations and share innovations in the region, both inside and outside Brazil.

In 2023, the Unlocking and Leveraging Low Emissions Development (Window B) project offered technical advice to environmental secretariats in the 9 states of the Legal Amazon to structure and strengthen plans to combat deforestation, so that socio-environmental safeguards are respected, and the benefits are shared with local populations.

At an international level, FAS, the Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) in the Amazon and the Peruvian government are planning to create a protection area at the source of the Amazon River, with the aim of combating the accelerated process of glacier melting caused by climate change.

MANAGEMENT AND TRANSPARENCY

Presence defines the management style of the Foundation for Amazon Sustainability. The organization has changed and adapted to the new times, between a pandemic and extreme weather events, but without losing this characteristic, which has always distinguished our vision and practice in the region. We are present in the territories, and we are at the side of the people of the Amazon, in the cities, forests and rivers, to improve their quality of life and guarantee prosperity, an objective that goes hand in hand with the conservation of the world's largest rainforest.

Through programs and projects in municipal offices, riverside communities and indigenous villages, we have representations in different corners of the state of Amazonas and offices in Manaus, Iranduba, Manicoré, Novo Aripuanã, Tefé, Fonte Boa and Carauari. In all, there are 142 collaborators, most of them black or brown, Amazonian, and female.

In the planning and implementation of strategic management, the Foundation for Amazon Sustainability relies on the independent and specialized consultancy of Bain&Company, one of the largest companies in the field in the world, to diagnose the organization's performance and impact in the Amazon region.



In tune with the demands of the socio-environmental environment, FAS management has prepared itself to move forward and embrace new alliances and opportunities: with the support of the Forest Fund and the REM (REDD Early Movers) project, the foundation is now helping the governments of Pará and Mato Grosso with actions to protect the environment and promote bioeconomy activities.

FAS adds to these initiatives its experience and methods in developing and managing large-scale projects in the Amazon region. Using integrated management systems and data intelligence, FAS will carry out financial management and offer technical assistance to environmental secretariats and other strategic players in these states.



The sustainable development programs and projects carried out by FAS are supported by sources of funding ranging from individual donations to incentives from business groups and multilateral funds. Our fundraising efforts, which in 2023 amounted to R\$68,359,114, include contributions from the governments of Germany and Great Britain. In 2023, FAS was one of the three finalist organizations in the "Climate Action" category and the

only Brazilian representative in the Zayed Sustainability Award, announced during COP-28. Among the recognitions of the serious and impactful work that the foundation carries out in the Amazon, we highlight the tribute granted by the Brazil Foundation, an institution that promotes philanthropy and evaluates non-governmental organizations according to high standards of governance and transparency.





Over its 15-year history, FAS has contributed to building knowledge about the biological and cultural diversity of the Amazon. The organization contributes to connecting ancestral knowledge with that of universities and scientific research centers in projects such as the Amazon-Edu Journeys, which promote meetings between academics and the guardians of the forest.

With the transversal agenda "FAS Knowledge", the foundation is also dedicated to disseminating Amazonian knowledge through technical-scientific production, adoption and dissemination of platforms, learning groups, events and publications. In 2023, FAS participated in the publication of 16 articles, as well as teaching materials adapted to regional realities.


