



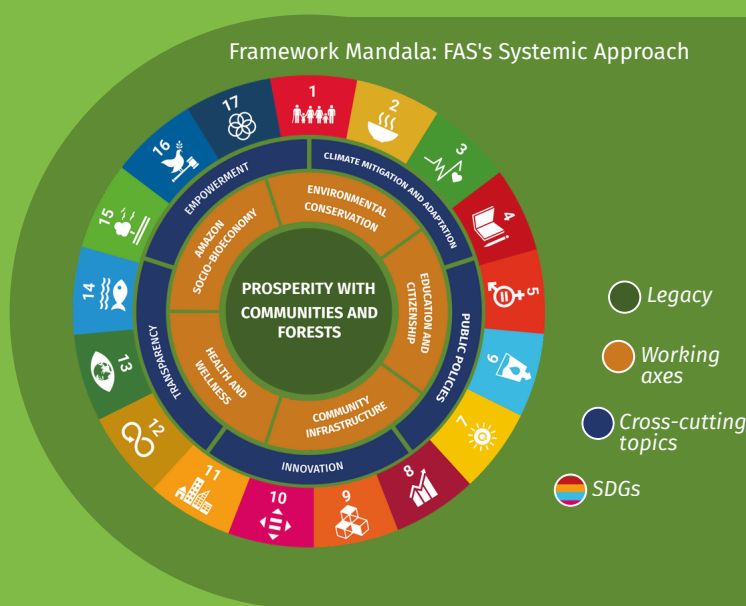
FAS: 18 years

Nature and people at the heart of our work

Since 2008, the Foundation for Amazon Sustainability (FAS) has developed solutions to one of the greatest challenges of our time: improving the quality of life of Amazonian populations while protecting the forest together with Indigenous, riverine and quilombola communities.

Represented by a framework mandala, FAS's approach brings together areas such as environmental conservation, education and citizenship, health and well-being, community infrastructure and the socio-bioeconomy — connecting people, territories and opportunities to promote the sustainable development of the Amazon.

Throughout its history, FAS has consolidated a social technology based on planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation carried out in a participatory manner with communities, fostering the joint development of solutions and sustainable transformation through a systemic approach adapted to different Amazonian territories. This model demonstrates that it is possible to generate environmental, social and economic results in an integrated manner and at scale.



More than conserving the forest, this work is about building pathways toward prosperity for the people who live in it, strengthening the Amazon as part of the response to global challenges related to the climate agenda and sustainable development.

Since 2008, FAS has developed solutions together with 1,313 partners, creating technologies suited to the different realities of the Amazon and contributing to the improvement of public policies and international cooperation programs.

Performance in 138 territories

covering 66 million hectares, including conservation units, Indigenous territories and quilombola territories since 2008.

2

15% reduction in deforestation in Amazonas

in areas historically supported by FAS since 2008, in addition to a 14% reduction in deforestation in Pará between 2024 and 2025.

3

295 technical and scientific publications

published by FAS since 2008, focusing on sustainable development in the Amazon.

4

17.2 million metric tons of CO₂ emissions avoided

through FAS's work in protected areas in the state of Amazonas since 2008.

5

R\$76 million distributed in payments for environmental services

through the Bolsa Floresta Program and the Forest Guardians Program, initiatives of the Government of Amazonas that benefited approximately 11,548 families between 2008 and 2024.

9 Innovation and Education Hubs

FAS established 9 (nine) Innovation and Education Hubs for Sustainable Development (Nieds) in 7 (seven) Conservation Units in Amazonas, aiming to provide local training and promote opportunities in the Amazon.

64 medals

won by Indigenous athletes between 2014 and 2025 in archery and Indigenous canoeing.

8

16,722 children and adolescents

from 11 municipalities in Amazonas benefited from initiatives aimed at protecting and guaranteeing their rights, strengthening their autonomy and developing their skills and potential.

Community Infrastructure

184 communities

benefited with the installation of internet access points, in partnership with Instituto Conexão Povos da Floresta, since 2023.

10

89 communities

benefited from the installation of household and productive-use solar energy systems since 2011, preventing the emission of approximately 622.68 metric tons of CO₂ between 2015 and 2025.

70 communities

benefited with water supply systems since 2017.

3,563 telehealth consultations

conducted between 2020 and 2025 in 65 communities through 66 telehealth access points.

183 territories

benefited by the Covid Amazon Alliance between 2020 and 2022, which mobilized 262 partners and raised more than R\$ 48 million.

Amazonian Socio-bioeconomy

14 production chains

supported since 2010. Among them: açaí, family farming, handicrafts, banana, cocoa, chestnut, cassava flour, guaraná, forest management, vegetable oils, pirarucu and tourism.

15

R\$36 million

In gross revenue generated between 2017 and 2025 by community-based tourism enterprises supported by FAS. Between 2024 and 2025, these enterprises recorded 27% growth.

35 approved audits

External audits conducted by PwC and approved without qualifications.

17

R\$560 million

Invested directly in projects across the territories where FAS operates, in partnership with 1,313 companies, governments and civil society organizations.

18

24 awards

Regional, national and international recognitions. In 2021, FAS was recognized as Brazil's best NGO by the Best NGOs Award.

Global scale



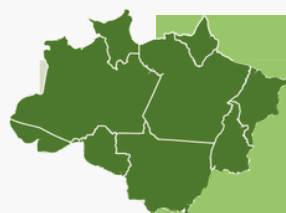
Participation in international thematic forums aligned with FAS's mission, such as the United Nations Climate Change and Biodiversity Conferences.
